

# SCRAPHOUSE

## ***Project Description***

CMG engages in an ongoing collaboration with Public Architecture, a San Francisco based not for profit firm that finds and cultivates projects that are typically overlooked by the private sector and government agencies.

Scraphouse was an intensive one month design-build exercise to create a structure out of 100% recycled material for the celebration of World Environment Day, held in San Francisco in part to commemorate the founding of the United Nations. Public Architecture gathered together and coordinated local designers, including CMG, to frame a conceptual approach to the building and then design various components overnight. A broad team of volunteer artists and builders, including the designers, constructed the house over four days in front of San Francisco's City Hall.

CMG is currently providing pro-bono design services to develop various mini open space sites throughout the South of Market district—a project originally conceived by Public Architecture and now sponsored by the Office of the Mayor for the San Francisco Green Streets Initiative program.
