

TREASURE ISLAND MASTER PLAN

Project Description

The Treasure Island Redevelopment Masterplan transforms this former military base at the center of San Francisco Bay into a vibrant new neighborhood that serves as a model for 21st century development and city living. The concept embraces the natural forces and beauty of the Bay, and combines a magnificent natural park with compelling urban design to create 300 acres of open space and parks, including civic parks and plazas, sports and recreation parks, a waterfront promenade, ferry plaza and harbor waterfront esplanade, wetlands, and a tidal marsh.

As a model for sustainable development, the design proposes innovative strategies for storm water management, transportation, urban agriculture, habitat reconstruction, and environmental stewardship. Biofiltration swales leading to wetlands filter storm water while also providing settings for recreation and education. Promenades and bike paths provide circulation throughout the island and promote a pedestrian-friendly environment, enhance the urban environment and capitalize on the spectacular setting of the development.
